Strengthening the partnership

The IDAC Strategic Framework is a guide to support dialogue and collaboration between IDAC partners, supporting co-investment, aligning efforts and networking & learning.

State and territory governments will be invited to collaborate with IDAC on specific initiatives within the IDAC portfolios, depending on the interest of each jurisdiction.

New philanthropic members will be invited to join IDAC, expanding the breadth and depth of the partnership. An engagement plan will be developed in early 2025.

Outcomes Fund

Establish an IDAC Social Impact Investment and Advisory Working Group to collaborate on projects under the Government's \$100 million Outcomes Fund.
